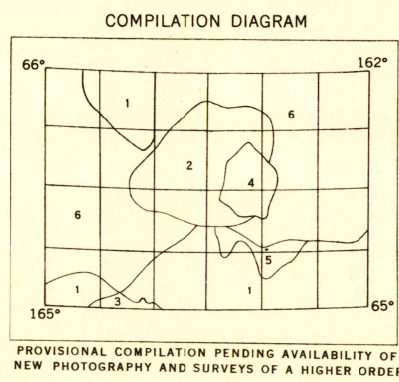
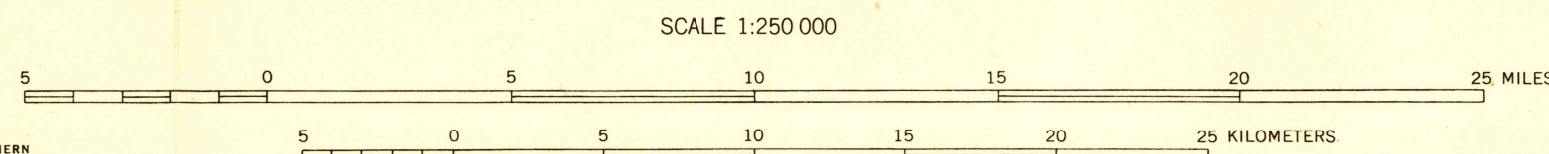

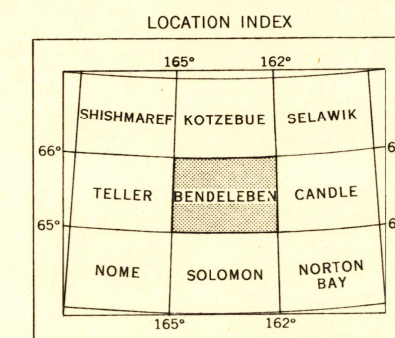


1. TOPOGRAPHY FROM ALASKA MAP 42
