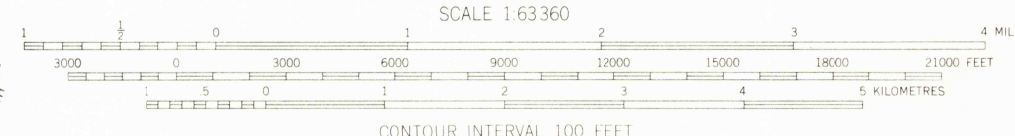
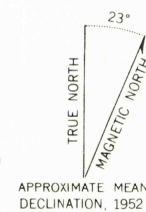
AFOGNAK (A-2) QUADRANGLE
