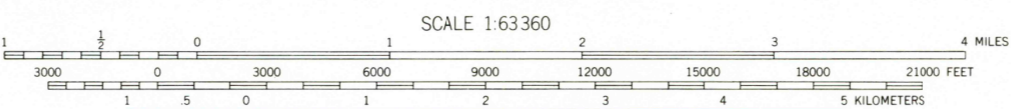

Alaska consisting of islands, islets, rocks, reefs, capes and spires
