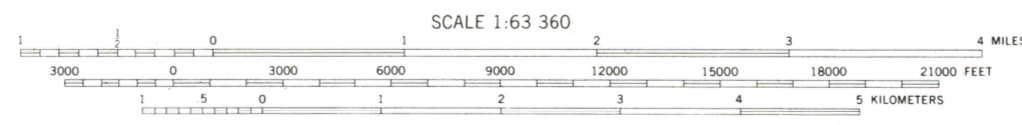
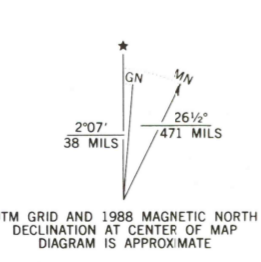

Folios CR-6 and CR-10, Copper River Meridian

Swamps, as portrayed, indicate only the wetter areas, usually of low relief, as interpreted from aerial photographs
