10,000 foot grid ticks based on Alaska coordinate system, zone 7, 1927 North American datum

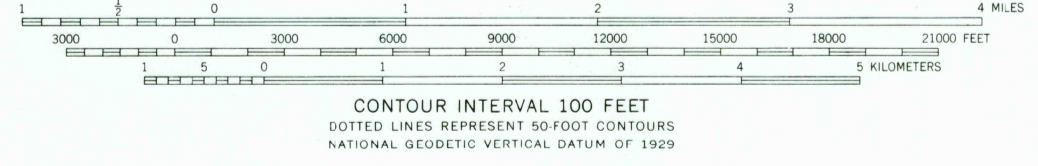
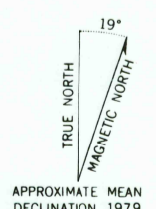
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines 87 meters north and 132 meters east
