

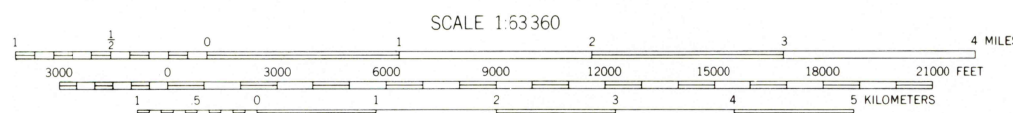
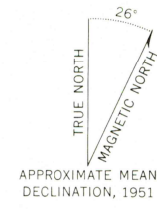

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines 65 meters north and 118 meters east  
Gray land lines represent unsurveyed and unmarked locations predetermined by the Bureau of Land Management  
Folios S-14 and S-15, Seward Meridian

Swamps, as portrayed, indicate only the wetter areas, usually of low relief, as interpreted from aerial photographs  
The Alaska Maritime National Wildlife Refuge consists of all the public lands in the coastal waters and adjacent seas of Alaska consisting of islands, islets, rocks, reefs, capes and spires, as well as designated mainland areas
