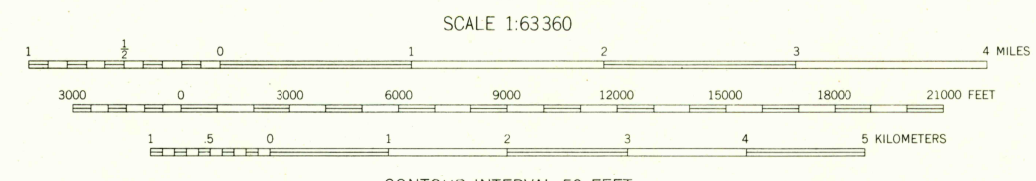
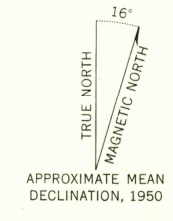
TELLER (B-5) QUADRANGLE
