

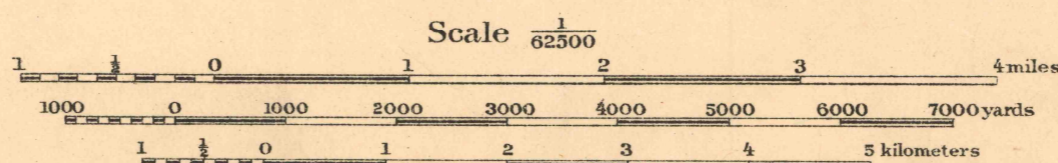


Field work and compilation under the direction of Col. W. M. Black, Corps of Engineers, U. S. A., Department Engineer, Eastern Department, 1910-1913.

Soundings expressed in feet and referred to mean low water, are from U. S. C. & G. S. Chart 187. Mean range of tide 0.1 ft.

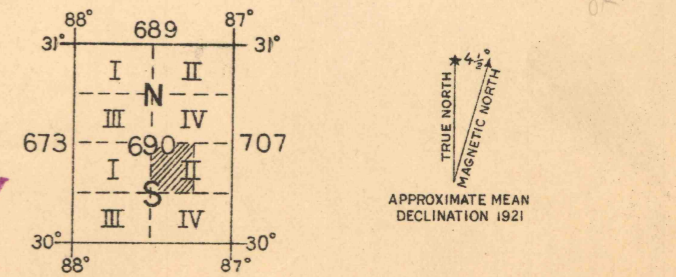
