



Tunnel: road; railroad

Built up area; locality; elevation.

Airport; landing field; landing strip.

National boundary.

State boundary.

County boundary.

U. S. public lands survey: range, township; section.

Range, township; section line: protracted.

Power transmission line; pipeline.

Dam; dam with lock.

Cemetery; building.
