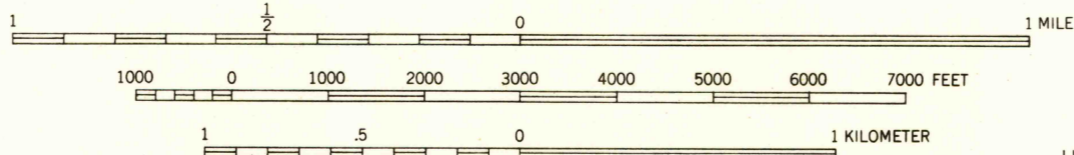
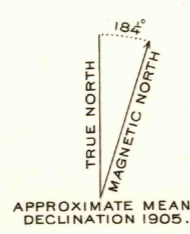


THIS AREA IS SHOWN ON THE MAP OF RUMSEY
