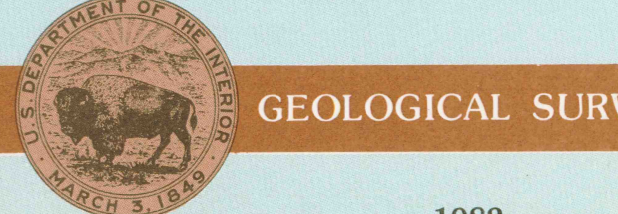


1:100 000-scale metric topographic map of Eaton COLORADO-WYOMING
