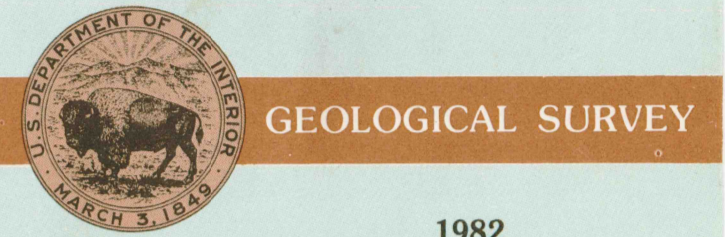


1:100 000-scale metric topographic map of **Kim** COLORADO-NEW MEXICO-OKLAHOMA
