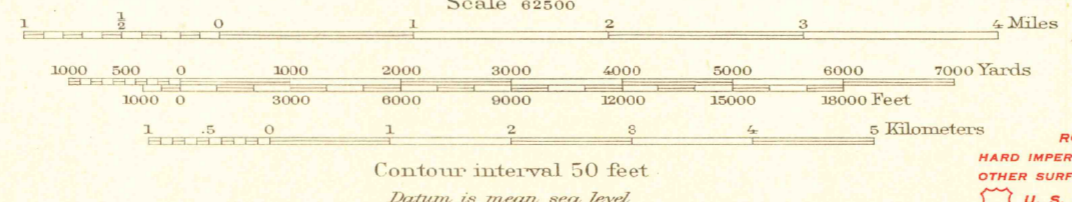


COLORADO SPRINGS (VIA U.S. HS. 24) 130 MI.
