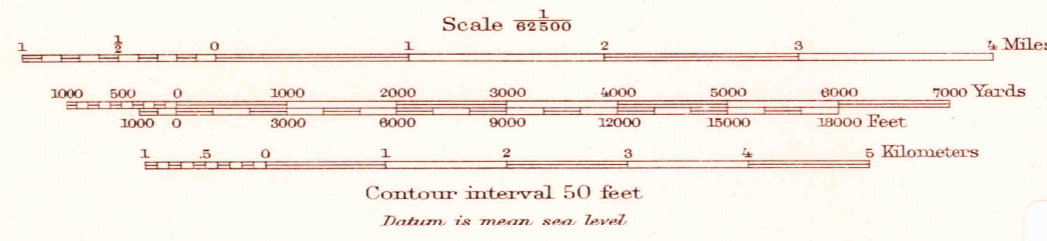

DECLINATION, 1912



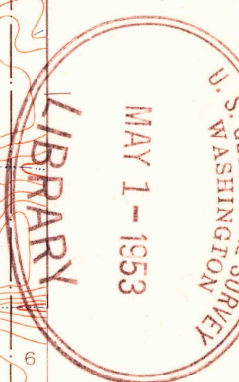
