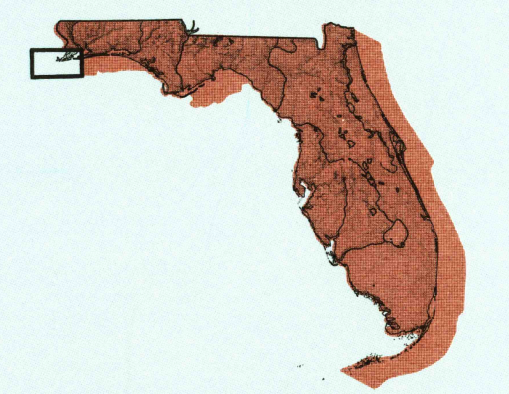
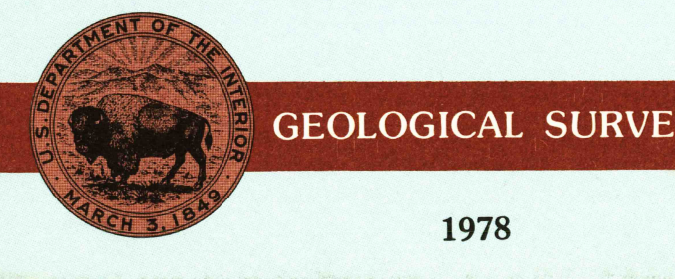


1:100 000-scale metric topographic map of Pensacola FLORIDA-ALABAMA
