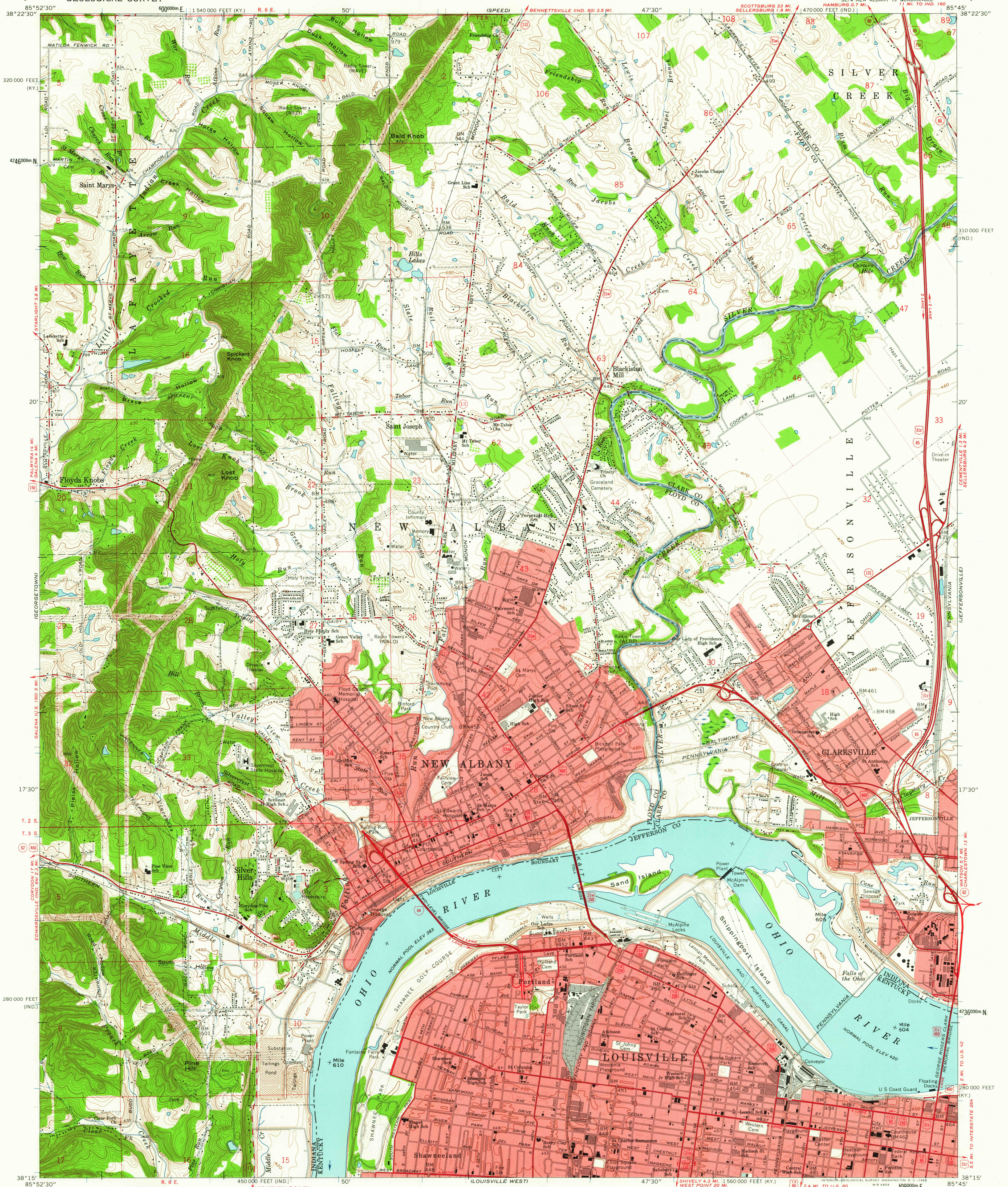

7.5 MINUTE SERIES (TOPOGRAPHIC)

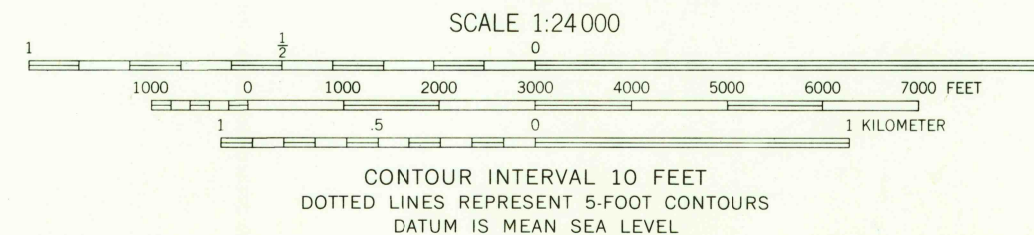

Topography by planetable surveys 1950. Entire map revised 1960.

Polyconic projection. 1927 North American datum. 10,000-foot grids based on Indiana coordinate system, east zone and Kentucky coordinate system, north zone. 1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 16, shown in blue.

The state boundary as shown represents the approximate position of the low water lines as determined from U. S. Corps of Engineers Ohio River charts, surveyed 1911-1912, and supplementary information. Red tint indicates areas in which only landmark buildings are shown. Dotted land lines established by private survey.
