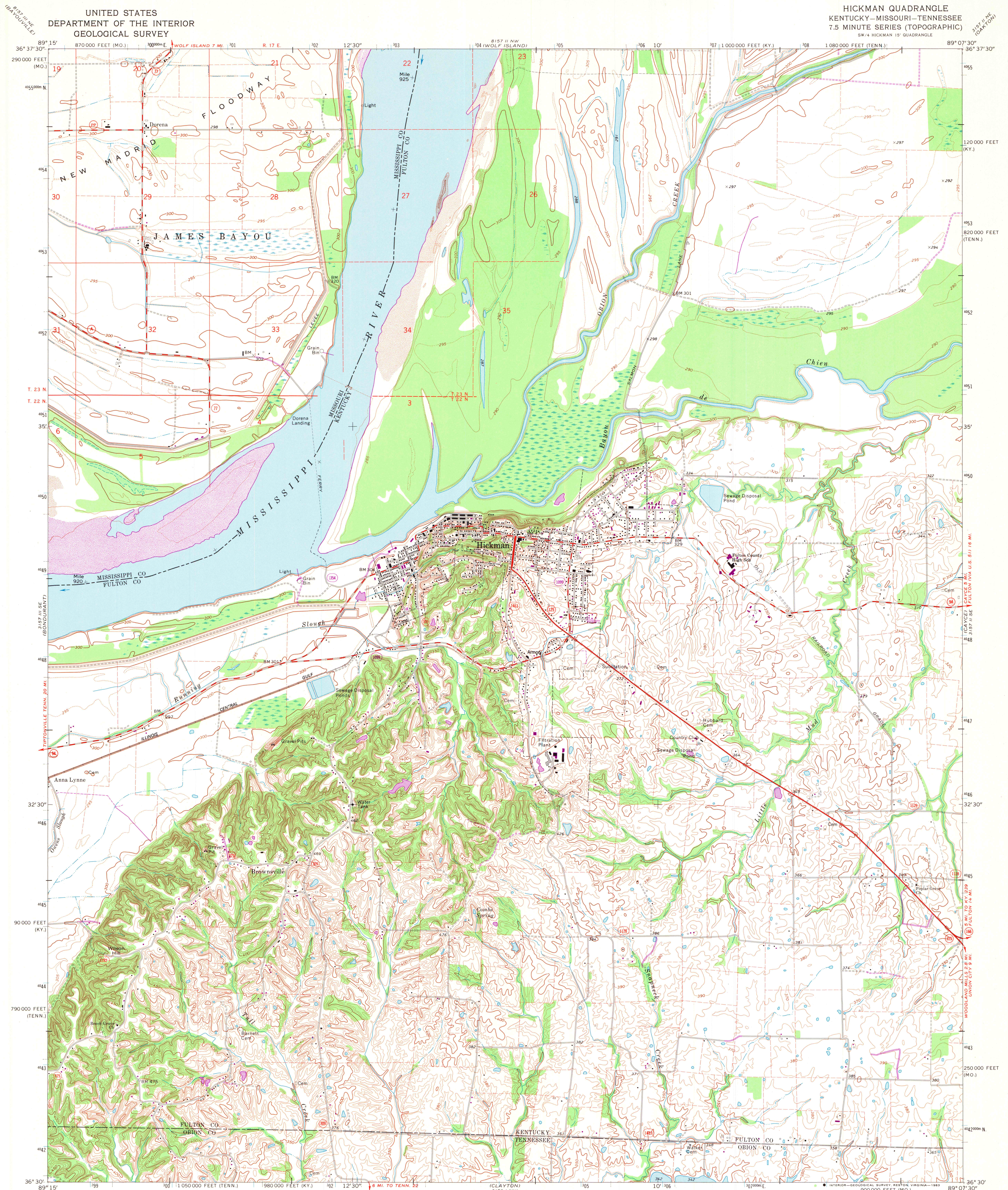

SW 4 HICKMAN 15' QUADRANGLE



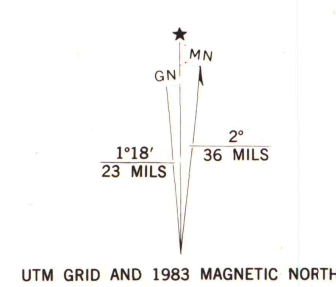

the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines
5 meters south and 6 meters east as shown by dashed
corner ticks
