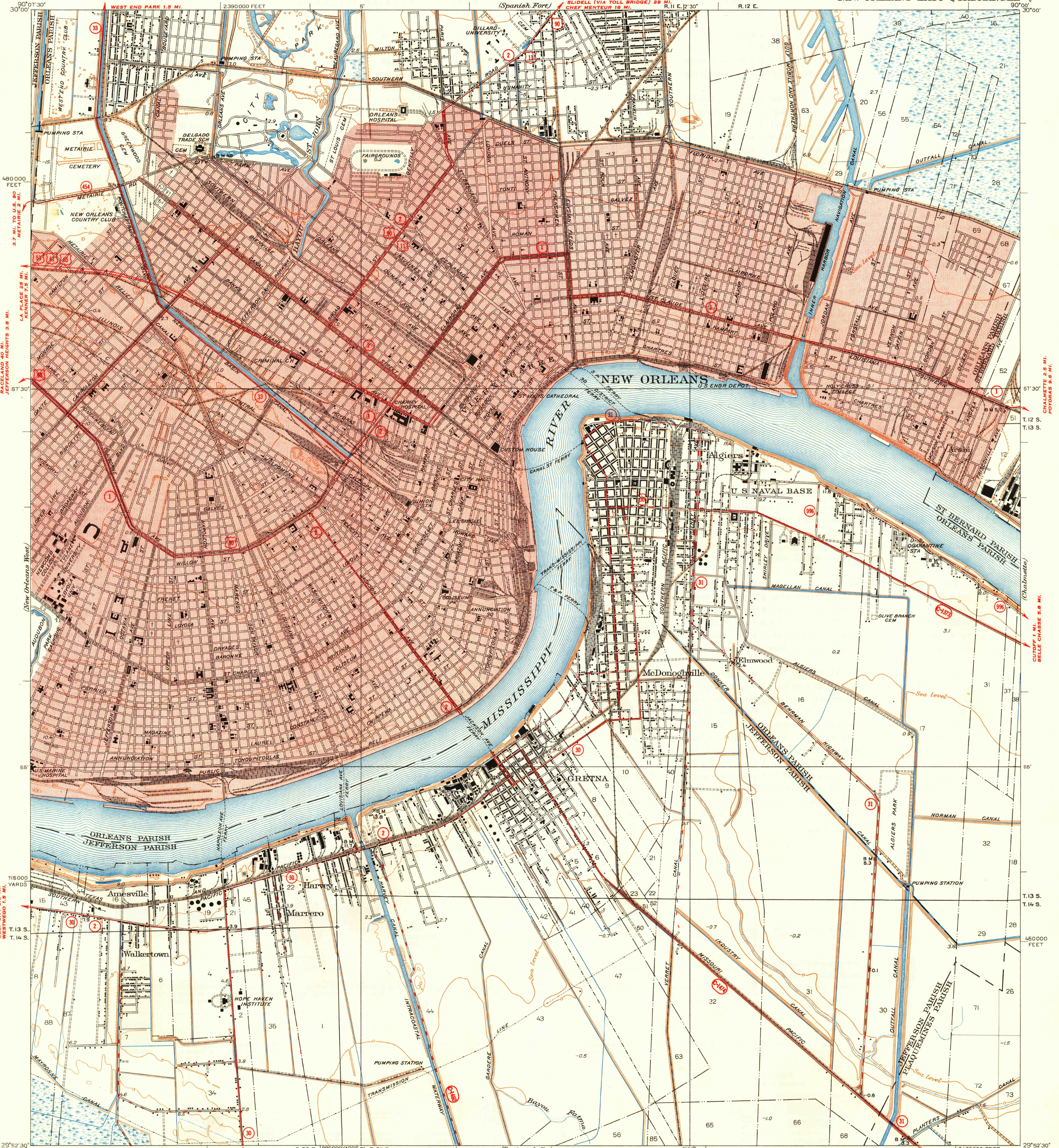

LOUISIANA NEW ORLEANS EAST QUADRANGLE



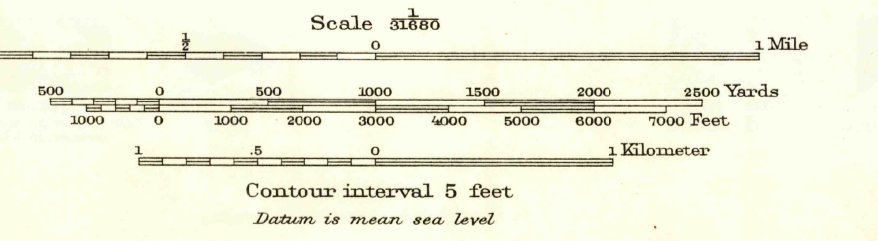
