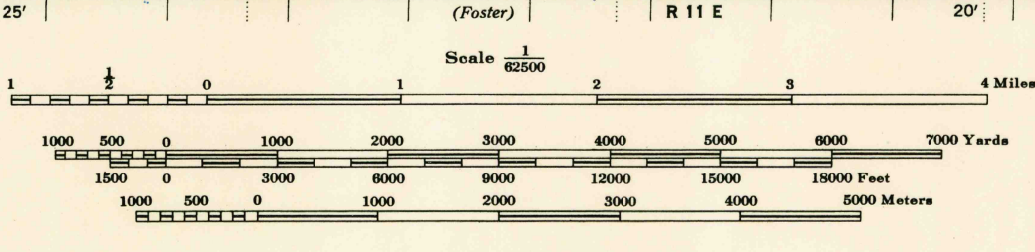


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Polyconic Projection, 1927 North American Datum.
Descriptions, elevations, and geodetic positions of permanent survey marks may be obtained from New Orleans District, Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army, New Orleans, Louisiana.
Topography by Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army, New Orleans District, 1930-34 and 1950. Planimetry remapped from aerial photographs by stereo methods.
Aerial photography October 1947, May 1948, and November 1949. Field checked 1950.
Contours in the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway are omitted.
Elevations shown in streams and along floodway ranges surveyed 1950-51, expressed in feet mean sea level.
Dashed land lines are projected.
Political boundaries are shown according to best available information.
Work under Flood Control Act shown as of April 1951.
