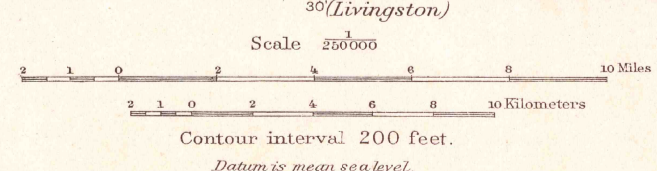
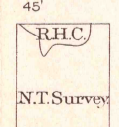
DRAINAGE
