There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of the National or State reservations shown on this map.

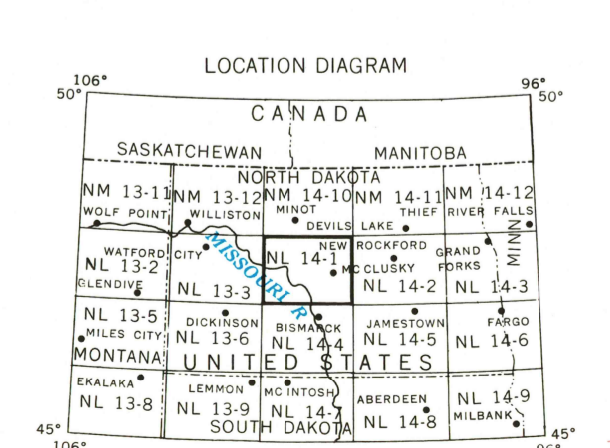

SAMPLE POINT: FORT CLARK

1. Read letters identifying 100,000 meter square in which the point lies.

2. Locate first VERTICAL grid line to LEFT of point and read LARGE figure labeling the line either in the top or bottom margin, or on the line itself.

3. Locate first HORIZONTAL grid line to LEFT of point and read LARGE figure labeling the line either in the left or bottom margin, or on the line itself.

4. Estimate tenths from grid line to point.

5. Estimate tenths from grid line to point.
