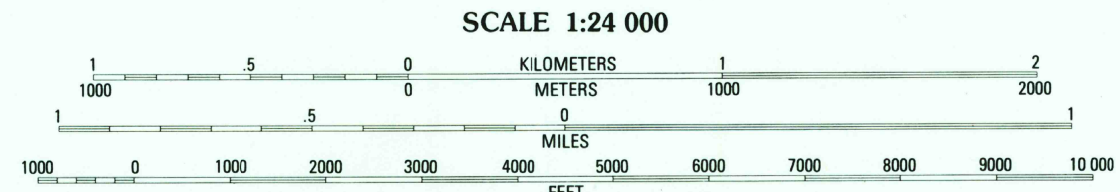
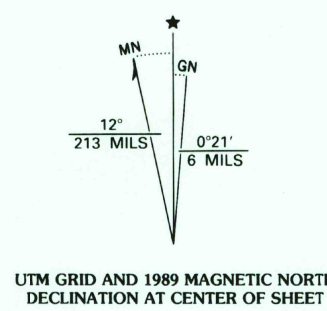

Gray tint indicates areas in which only landmark buildings are shown

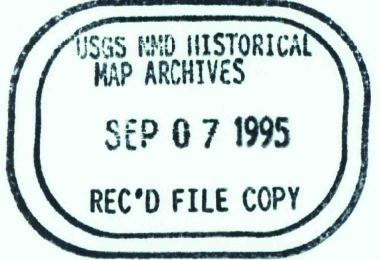
