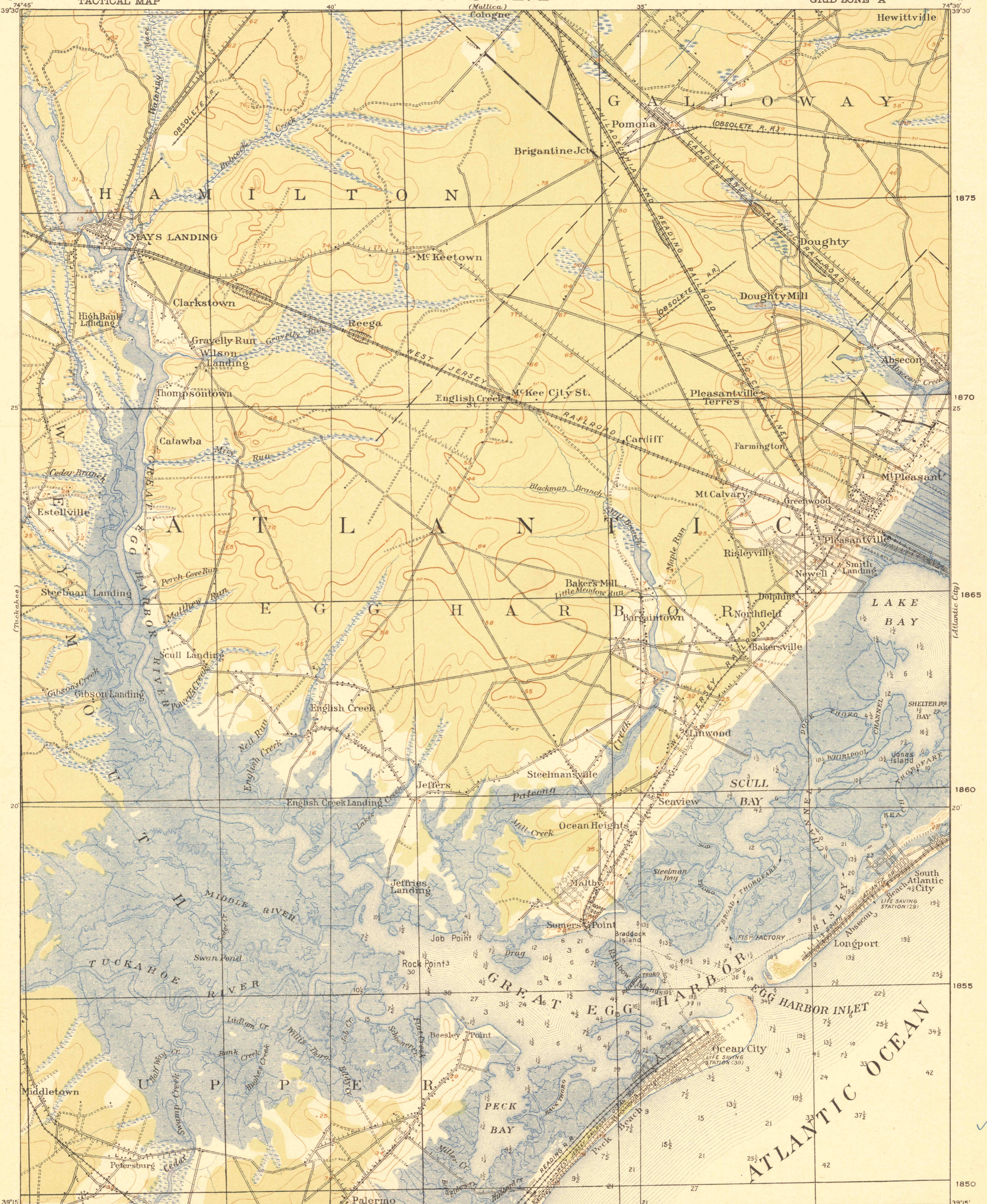


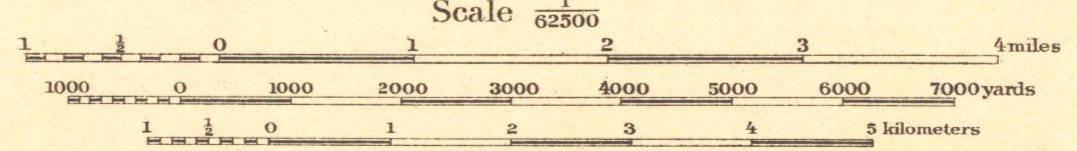

Little Egg Harbor



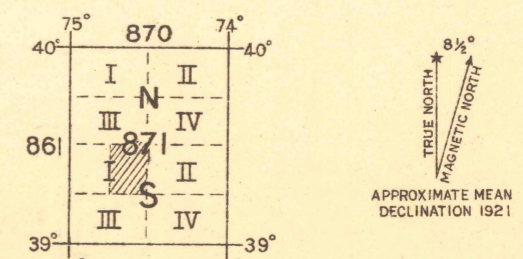
