

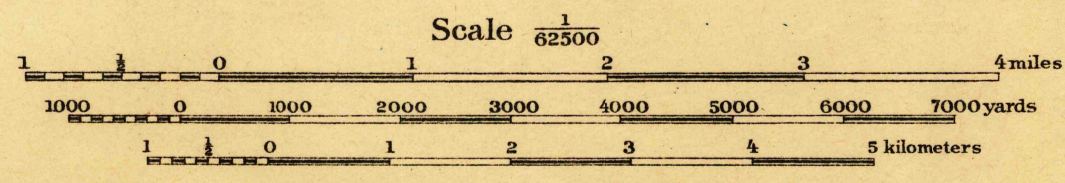


Base map from U. S. G. S. engravings. Surveyed in 1902.

Soundings expressed in feet and referred to mean low water, are from U. S. C. & G. S. Charts Nos. 115 and 116.

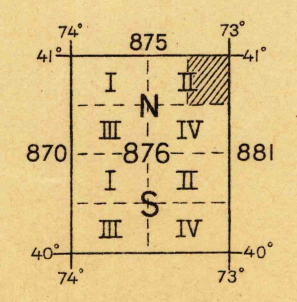
