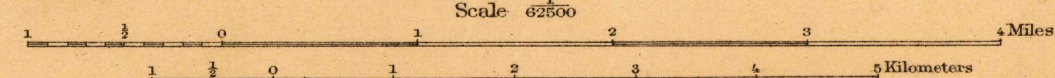

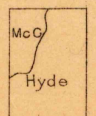
Note: The elevation of Lake Champlain according to latest determination is 33 feet. The contours on this map are drawn to an earlier determination of 30 feet.
