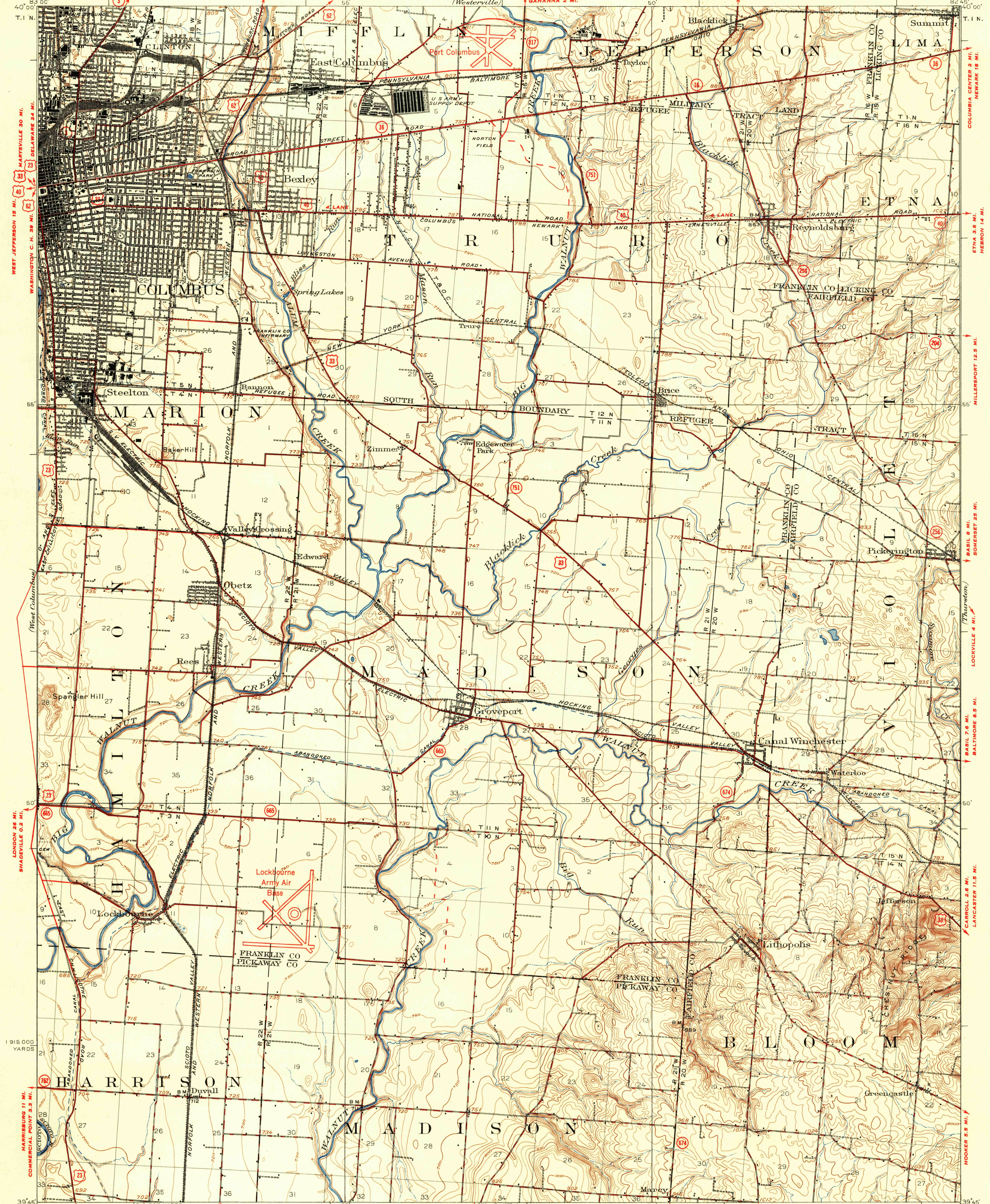

EAST COLUMBUS QUADRANGLE



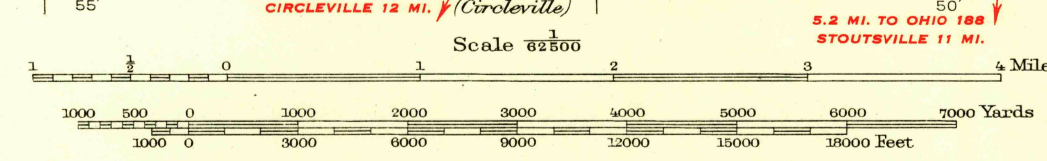
