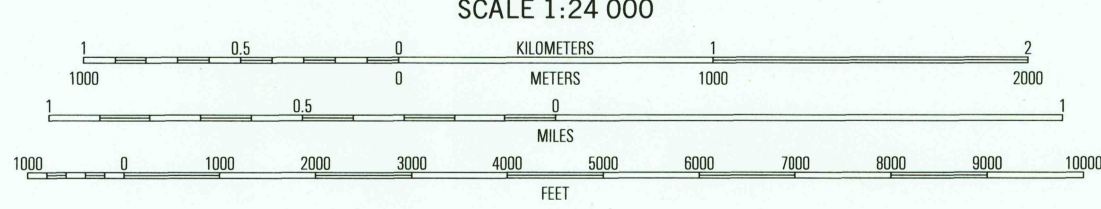
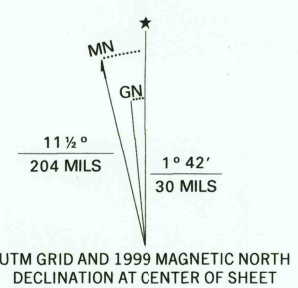


RECEIVED JUN 30 2000 USGS AND HISTORICAL MAP ARCHIVES

Produced by the United States Geological Survey in cooperation with Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Bureau of Topographic and Geologic Survey. Topography compiled 1942. Planimetry derived from imagery taken 1971 and other sources. Photospectroscopy using imagery dated 1994; no major culture or drainage changes observed. Survey control current as of 1947. Boundaries revised 1999. North American Datum of 1927 (NAD 27). Projection and 10 000-foot ticks: Pennsylvania coordinate system, north zone (Lambert conformal conic). 1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid, zone 18. North American Datum of 1983 (NAD 83) is shown by dashed corner ticks. The values of the shift between NAD 27 and NAD 83 for 7.5-minute intersections are obtainable from National Geodetic Survey NADCON software. There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of the National or State reservations shown on this map. Information shown in purple may not meet USGS content standards and may conflict with previously mapped contours.
