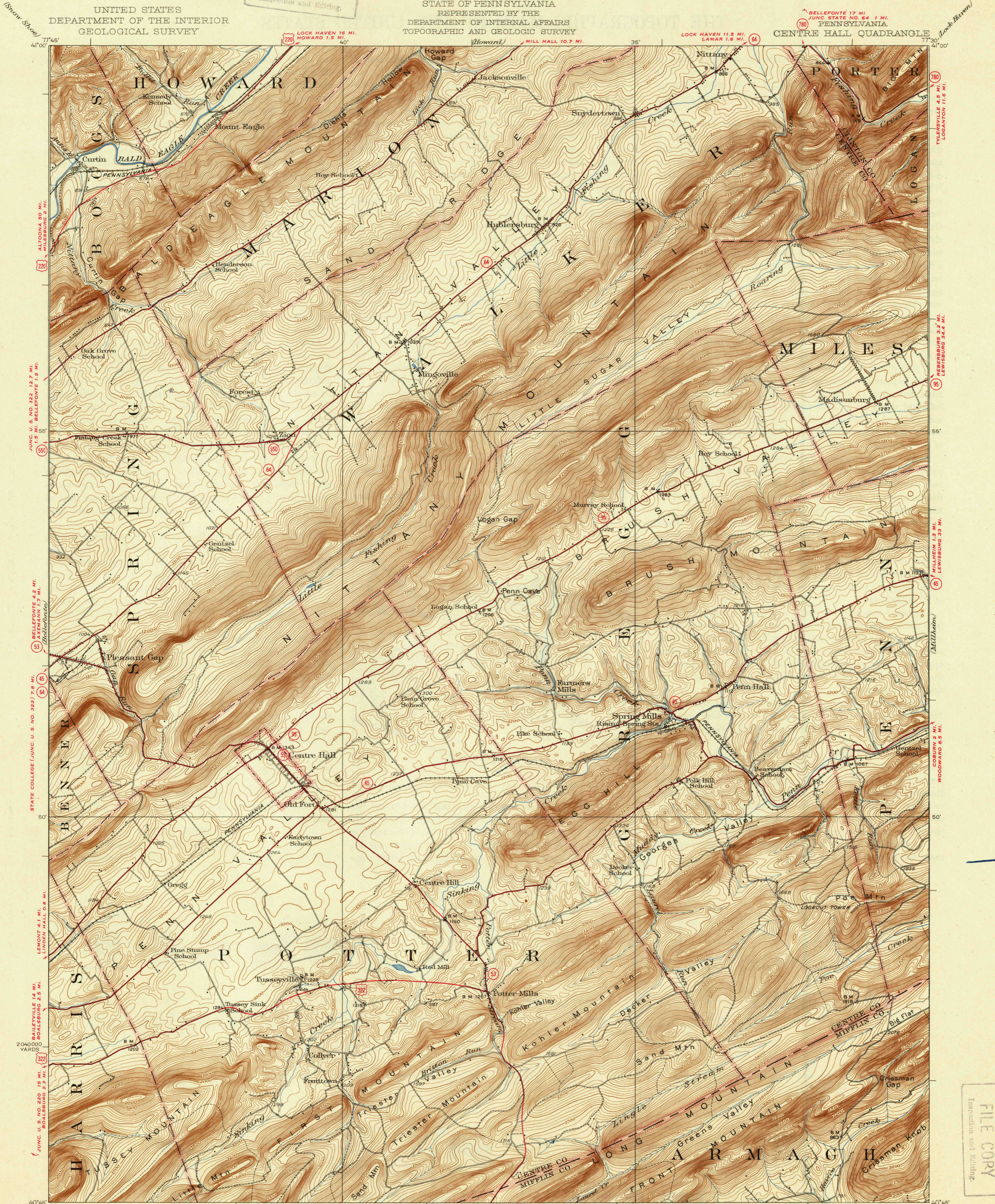

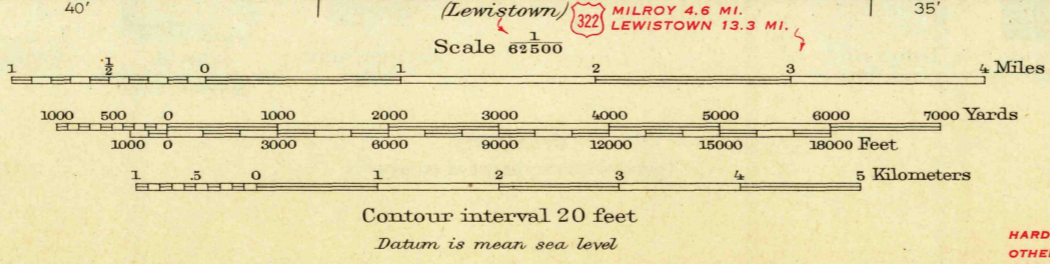
BELLEFONTE 17 MI. JUNCO STATE NO. 64 1 MI. PENNSYLVANIA CENTRE HALL QUADRANGLE
