

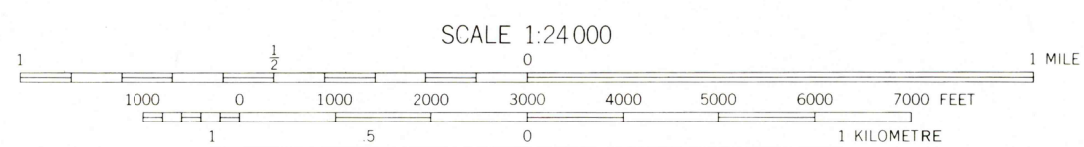
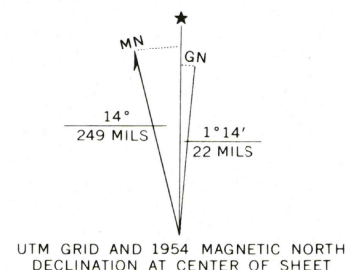

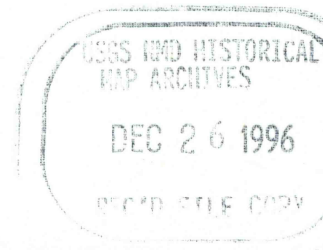
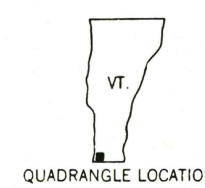
1000-metre Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 18, shown in blue
